

THE INVESTMENT

The \$16 million from bond issue proceeds will be used for the following:

Area Security and Safety Upgrades

\$1.4 million for improved security and surveillance access/control and camera systems, exterior locks, and site lighting at all DACC locations.

Infrastructure Improvements

\$1.15 million for maintenance and repair, and site development to DACC campuses and centers.

Classroom Upgrades, Facility Renewal, and Renovations

\$2.85 million for renovation and re-purposing to selected instructional areas at all DACC sites, including room configuration, furniture, room finishes, and instructional equipment.

Information Technology, Upgrades, and Equipment Acquisition

\$2.5 million will be allocated for enhancing IT infrastructure, IT and sercvice rooms, as well as audio-visual spaces across all DACC locations.

Facilities

\$8.1 million for improvement to the Sunland Park Center to replace portables with permanent classrooms, and provision of science labs, and student areas.

THE RETURN ON INVESTMENT

The DACC Bond will provide funding for security, safety, and infrastructure, plus upgrade and re-purpose instructional areas. Additionally, it will advance and update DACC information technology at all locations. the Sunland Park Center facility will replace portables with permanent classrooms, science labs and student areas.


